More Support for Mississauga Halton LHIN

Ontario is helping the Mississauga Halton Local Integration Health Network (LHIN) and LHINs across the province provide more seniors with care at home, reduce unnecessary emergency room visits and readmissions, decrease the number of patients waiting for alternate levels of care, and increase local addiction services.

This investment is helping deliver on [Ontario's Action Plan for Health Care](#) by providing the right care at the right time and in the right place.

Mississauga Halton LHIN is receiving an increase of \$8,819,500 million to fund local programs this year. These include:

- \$5,120,000 for the Mississauga Halton Community Care Access Centre (MH CCAC)
- \$1,500,000 for Addiction and Mental Health Treatment Services
- \$2,199,500 for Community Based Programs

Bathing Program	Seniors Life Enhancement Centre	A client bathing program will be provided as support for up to 30 clients and their informal caregivers who are unable to manage bathing.	\$10,985
Central Registry for Intake and Referral in the Delivery of In-Home Respite Services	Nucleus Independent Living	<p>A new central intake and referral centre for respite care will be provided 7 days a week including: 12 hours on the weekdays and 8 hours on the weekends.</p> <p>This central registry will offer one number to call to access in-home respite services across the region helping integrate, coordinate and increase accessibility to respite services within the Mississauga Halton LHIN.</p> <p>An Assessment and Referral Coordinator and Intake Specialist will be hired to staff the centre and begin the assessment of clients and caregivers.</p>	\$85,508

Caregiver Support (Respite Services), Health Promotion Education, and Crisis Management will be supported through additional respite hours (including evening hours) and enhanced services for client centred counselling and relaxation programs, helping reduce stress on caregivers while improving clients' physical, emotional and mental well-being.	\$136,088

Mental Health First Aid Training	Dixie Bloor Neighbourhood Centre	Dixie Bloor Neighbourhood Center in partnership with the Alzheimer Society Peel will work in collaboration for the provision of training twenty-four staff in the Mental Health Commission of Canada's Mental Health First Aid and Crisis Intervention Certificate Program. The successful twenty-four educators will then proceed to share the education program with a minimum of three communities or agencies each. The workshops will be delivered considering the MH LHIN language diversity. The estimated impact for this program delivery is approximately a community of 700. The program delivery will raise awareness and strengthen the skill sets to support and manage individuals living with mental health challenges.	\$120,250
Caregiver First-Expanded Adult Day Services	Sheridan Villa	Sheridan Villa Long-Term Care Home (Region of Peel) will be extending services in the Adult Day Program to include two evenings a week from 3-9 p.m. and weekends from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. Sheridan Villa will also provide a community client bathing service. This will provide relief to caregivers who are unable to manage bathing due to their own physical health limitations or due to inadequate bathroom facilities in their home.	\$52,711
Emergency Response Fund for Community Support Service Providers	All Community Support Service Providers	Community health service providers will have access to a new emergency response fund. This increased support will help those clients who need extra service due to a sudden illness or when providers would be able to care for a client for a short term timeframe, if further funding was available. This will allow clients to remain in their homes whenever possible with access to further funding for a short period of time.	\$500,000
In-Home Respite Care Program	TBA	Health service providers will partner to deliver in-home respite care to caregivers across the LHIN. The program will allow a menu of services to be customized for the caregiver, smooth access to services, support the caregiver and maintain flexibility of services in order to address caregiver need.	\$250,000
